Morning Welcome Routine

During busy times routines are a great tool to help organise and bring structure into our life.

At Cardijn College Galilee our staff are aware of the importance of routines. In each home room they have a morning welcome routine, which occurs at the beginning of each day. The primary purpose of this routine is to support each child to establish connection. We know that learners make sense of learning by connecting with what is around us, where we are and who we are with. This welcome routine develops a sense of emotional safety in the context of establishing the home room community. It brings people together, supports relationships and creates connections.

The morning routine is an important element of the Berry Street educational model. The Berry Street educational model is proven to improve students' self-regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth, and academic achievement. The model consists of five domains; body, stamina, character, relationship, and engagement. Each of the domains are fundamental in promoting well-being and learning.

The morning welcome routine is a whole school approach that fits in to the rhythm of the school. Research shows that belonging at school is key to well-being and achievement as is connection within the family. **Thus, it is very important children are on time each morning and establish a positive learning culture at the beginning of the day.** If your child is experiencing difficulty coming to school, please let us know so we can support you. Creating connections is more than a lone process but a process involving all of the community.
