Building Names

Galilee Catholic school was established in 2007 and the vision for 'Galilee' is like the Galilee of Jesus' time. The Galilee of Jesus was a place where he lived his childhood, learnt, and began his ministry. As a Catholic Campus, Galilee carries the mission of Jesus in the context of our place at Aldinga today.

For the past 17 years the Galilee buildings have been named after the stage of development 1, 2 and 3. This year after consultation with staff, students, and parents (town hall gathering term 2), I am pleased to announce it is time to recognise the significant scripture locations of Jesus life and ministry and name each building. Along with connection to Christian scripture each building has a symbol signifying our commitment to environmental ideals of the local surroundings.

Early Years = **Nazareth** (marigold)

Stage 1 = **Jordan** (water)

Stage 2 = Cana (vine)

Stage 3 = **Bethsaida** (hills)

Middle School = **Emmaus** (light)

We intend to make the focus of our Together We Grow Day in week 8, around these names to engage students in the stories and connect with the names and symbols. It will be an opportunity to help students see themselves as part of this story and help to make the building names relevant to our community.

Dogs Connect

We are excited to announce that we are about to launch the Dogs Connect program in our campus. This is a campus wellbeing program which will see the introduction of a wellbeing dog in our community. Our campus wellbeing dog will become a much loved and important member of our community.

Eco-Literacy

Year 5 – Eco literacy lessons

This term Mrs Janssan and Miss Currie's Homegroups have been visiting the Galilee Wetlands as part of their Eco literacy lessons to deepen their understanding of 'light' and the affects it has on the life in the wetlands.

Students learnt how to use the turbidity tubes to collect data on the turbidity of our 3 ponds in the wetlands. The students found that pond 2 has the lowest turbidity meaning that it is the cleanest pond which enables a variety of macroinvertebrates to survive.







Magic Harvest 'Pass it on' lessons

As part of our Magic Harvest Program this week, Stage 2 students participated in the 'Pass it on' lessons. This is a concept that enables students to demonstrate a gardening skill and 'pass it on' to family and friends. Our Year 4 Homegroups harvested produce from our garden beds and learnt how to make cold rolls. Delicious!




