End of Semester Reports

Starting this term Galilee Reception to year 6 report will look different. The report changes will provide a clear concise representation of each child's progress with the Australian Curriculum. In line with the new reporting format, parents can expect to receive a one-page summary of their child's progress, along with a general comment by the homeroom teacher. A more detailed information about a child's progress is always available through learning conversations arranged by appointment.
